

How to Send Payments in Euros as Non-SEPA Payments



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
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1 Instructions for ZKB eBanking


1 When entering a **bank payment abroad** in ZKB eBanking, click on **Show** under **Additional Instructions (optional)**.



Remove the checkmark from The order is executed as a SEPA payment where possible.




Click on Next.



Verify the information confirming that the payment will not be processed as a SEPA payment.

Note: If a payment is subsequently changed, the SEPA eligibility is checked once more and the SEPA checkmark must be removed again.




5 Click on **Confirm payment** to submit the payment.


Alternatively, when entering a bank payment abroad, you can change the **charge** option from **Shared Charges (SHA)** to either **Beneficiary (BEN)** or **Ordering party (OUR)** to send the payment in euros as a non-SEPA payment.

2 Instructions for ZKB Mobile Banking

- 1 Enter a new payment in ZKB Mobile Banking.
- Select the payment type International transfer.





- 3 Complete the recipient's payment details and click on Next.
- 4 Check the debit account and enter the payment amount. Then click on **Next**.





- 5 **Disable** the **SEPA option** by sliding the **SEPA toggle** to the left.
- 6 Click on Next.





- Verify in the payment **Details** that the payment will not be processed as a SEPA payment.
- 8 Click on **Confirm** to submit the payment order.



Note

Alternatively, when entering an international transfer, you can change the **charge** option from **Shared fees (SHA)** to either **Beneficiary (BEN)** or **Ordering party (OUR)** to send the payment in euros as a non-SEPA payment. First, deactivate the SEPA option as described in **Chapter 2**, and then select the desired charge option under **Additional Instructions**.

3 Instructions for File Upload for Corporates

In the pain.001 file, the code word /NONSEPA/ can be specified (see the two variants below) to execute the payment in euros as a regular bank payment abroad:

Variant 1



PmtInf (Payment Information) +PmtTpInf (Payment Type Information) ++SvcLvI (Service Level) +++Prtry (Proprietary)

Variant 2



PmtInf (Payment Information) +InstrForDbtrAgt (Instruction for Debtor Agent)

Variant 3



Alternatively, you can enter the charge code for Beneficiary (BEN/CRED) or Ordering Party (OUR/DEBT) to execute the payment in euros as a regular bank payment abroad. Please refer to the information about charge options in **Chapter 4** of this document.

4 Charge Options

Charge option	Charge code	Description
Beneficiary	BEN/CRED	 Payment is free of charge for you. All additional costs incurred domestically and internationally (including those of ZKB of CHF 4 for a payment abroad) will be deducted from the beneficiary's transfer amount.
Ordering Party	OUR/DEBT	 You pay the fee of ZKB CHF 4 for a payment abroad and an additional flat fee of CHF 20. The beneficiary receives the full transfer amount credited to their account. The recipient bank may levy charges.
Shared Charges / Shared Fees	SHA/SHAR	 You pay the fee of ZKB of CHF 4 for a payment abroad. The additional costs incurred domestically and internationally will be deducted from the beneficiary's transfer amount. Costs may vary.
